- All work to be exhibitor's own and must be done since September 2022.
- No entry fee. Entrants must use regular tags obtained from the secretary or treasurer and properly completed with Class, Section, Exhibitor's Name, Entry Number and School or Address. If entered through school, please write/stamp school name on the back of the work.
- All entries must be the work of one individual unless otherwise stated.
- Only one entry per category.
- Grade as of September 1, 2022 (may enter in older grade sections).
- Entries which do not meet required rules and regulations will be disqualified.

Note to Parents: Parents are urged to allow children to do the work and preparations of the exhibits themselves with your encouragement.

Section 'A' – Preschool

1. Create a Play Dough cob of corn
2. Draw a picture of your family.
3. Make a collection of purple items displayed in an egg carton.
4. Trace your hand and decorate it.
5. Make a car out of Lego. Display it on a paper plate
6. Colour a printed page or a page from a colouring book.

Section 'B' – Jr. Kindergarten

7. Draw your favourite farm animal.
8. Create a Play Dough piece of fruit the size of your hand, put it on a paper plate.
9. Make a ladybug made from a small paper plate.
10. Collection of 6 painted stones, displayed in half an egg carton.
11. Make a tractor out of Lego. Display it on a paper plate.
12. Make a picture using stickers and pencil crayons.

Prizes:

The winner of each class A, B, and C at Parkhill Fair will receive a ribbon and is invited submit their work to represent Parkhill Fair at the District 13 competition of local fairs in November.

**District winners Class A, B & C: 1st - \$ 25.00,
2nd - \$ 15.00, 3rd - \$ 10.00**

Rules:

- Theme – Promoting our Parkhill Fair and our theme "Summer Fun Happens Here". Name and date of fair must be clearly shown on poster. (Parkhill Fair, August 11th to 13th, 2023)
- Must be hand drawn.
- Poster size – Minimum – 8.5" x 11" (22 cm x 28 cm), without border, to Maximum – 11" x 17" (28 cm x 44 cm), without border.
- Each entry must be centered on a cardstock or Bristol board exposing a 2" border on all sides.
- Name of fair, District number #13, contact person, owner of poster and school to be clearly labelled on the **back** of each entry.
- Do not attach an entry tag to the poster, all information is to be recorded on the **BACK** of the poster.

Judging Criteria:

- Overall appearance – 50 points
- Hand Drawn – 35 points
- O.A.A.S. Criteria (size, material, theme) – 15 points.
