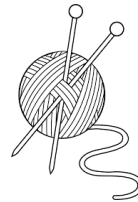
Rules:

Crocheting Champion:

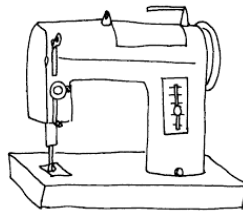

Quilts:

Exhibitor must be an individual (not a group)

- 70. Quilt – hand appliqued – any size
- 71. Quilt – hand quilted/pieced – any size
- 72. Quilt – for child’s crib (No hand tied quilts)
- 73. Quilt – machine quilted (cannot be crib quilt)
- 74. Quilted wall hanging- must having top casing/loops
- 75. Comforter – tied – any size
- 76. Any quilted item incorporating theme “Small Town, All Heart”
- 77. Lap quilt – any style
- 78. Quilt – using preprinted top and any method of quilting
- 79. Quilt – made from recycled blue jeans.
- 80. Recycled quilt – made from old clothing pieces
- 81. Any other quilted item not previously mentioned

First-place winners of either Hand-made or Machine-made Quilts that meet the size requirements may be invited to submit their entry to the OAAS District level competition in November. You will represent Parkhill Fair and compete against the winning entry from other local District 13 fairs. See the OAAS Competition page at the end of this book for more information.

Quilting Champion:

The exhibitor receiving the most points in sections 70 to 81 in Quilts will be declared Quilting Champion, will receive \$50 and be invited to the Awards Presentation.
Winner is eligible once every 2 years.
